

# Altrusa International

The first club of Altrusa International was founded in Nashville, Tennessee on April 11, 1917, as Altrusa Institute. Dr. Alfred Durham, a member of Kiwanis, organized clubs throughout Louisville, KY, and Dayton, OH, before he moved on to Indianapolis, IN, where he met Mamie L. Bass. The Altrusa Institute became a classified service organization for women. Later, Mamie L. Bass created the Principles of Altrusa which defined Altrusa as a builder of women and an organization based on merit and accomplishment. The Principles were officially adopted in 1921.

By 1922, Altrusa had 20 clubs. On September 1, 1935, Altrusa became international when the first club in Mexico was organized. Since then, Altrusa moved into Puerto Rico, Chile, Ecuador, India, Korea, Russia, Ukraine, Ireland, Great Britain, Bermuda, Canada, and New Zealand. In 1962, Altrusa International established the Altrusa International Foundation, which is dedicated to improving economic well-being and quality of life through a commitment to community to community services and literacy.

Altrusa International of Gainesville has a long history of support, encouragement, and leadership in community services and educational and vocational training opportunities for women.

As of October 2017, Altrusa has around 8,000 members in 313 clubs from 13 countries, including Canada, New Zealand, and the United States.

# Altrusa House

Altrusa House serves a distinctive adult population in the Gainesville community. Without the existence of Altrusa House, these adults would not have a safe place to gather and engage in rehabilitative activies.

Fundraising for the Altrusa House of Gainesville started with Altrusa International of Gainesville over an eight-year planning period. Thanks to Altrusa International, the City of Gainesville, and the Gainesville community, Altrusa House of Gainesville was able to raise more than \$400,000 and acquire the land required to build the facility. Altrusa House of Gainesville opened in October 1998, built upon the land donated by the City of Gainesville, alongside Greentree Park.

While members are under Altrusa House's care, family members are able to return to work, run errands, or make appointments with the peace of mind that their loved one will receive quality care in a safe, stimulating environment. Our programs at Altrusa House are designed to enhance the overall well-being of our members.

Altrusa House is proud to cooperate with the Veterans Administration to serve a large and growing number of local veterans, providing them with the care and dignity they deserve. Altrusa House is also proud to work alongside Easterseals for 20 years to better the Gainesville community.

# Altrusa Club The Dreamakers

**Saturday, May 31, 1958:** The Altrusa Club of Gainesville is founded with a welcoming address by the president of the Altrusa Club of Jacksonville, sponsor of the new club.

**1963-64:** Altrusa Club of Gainesville begins its first service project, the booklet entitled "Gainesville Services and Activities for Retired Citizens"

**1972-73:** The club began a tradition of serving coffee to new citizens following their Naturalization Ceremonies at the U.S. District Courthouse.

1976-77: The Altrusa Club of Ocala was chartered under Altrusa Club of Gainesville's sponsorship. The Gainesville Club began a program at Santa Fe Community College to provide scholarships for women over age 25 who are seeking new career opportunities.

**1978-79:** Altrusa of Gainesville was instrumental in the sale of Camp Crystal and encouraging retention of the camp as part of the Alachua County educational program.

1981-82: The club established an Altrusa Club in Lake City. Our club was given an award by the local Voluntary Action Center for our continued support of Camp Crystal.

**1983-84:** Altrusa Club of Gainesville became the first organization from Alachua County to sponsor a booth at the Florida State Fair in Tampa

**1985-86:** A three year project began with the Gainesville Girls Club to supply \$5,000 for the capital building fund designated for the library.

1991-92: Altrusa Club of Gainesville sponsored a new club in Starke. The Alachua County Distinguished Service award was presented to our club for our ongoing Alachua County State Fair exhibit. Altrusa Club of Gainesville extended an Altrusa Club into Novorossiisk, Russia, a Gainesville Sister City. Our club was recognized by the Rotary Club and the Volunteer Center with the Volunteer of the Year Award for Outstanding Civic Club.

1996-97: The first annual Altrusa Read-In for Literacy brought volunteers to every public elementary school in Alachua County. The volunteers read a book to each kindergarten and first grade class and served as role models on the importance of literacy and the joys of reading.

1997-98: The Santa Fe Community College Scholarships for non-traditional students became an endowed fund, which continues today. The ASTRA Club, an offshoot of Altrusa for students, was established at the University of Florida.

**2004-05:** The membership approved the "Fashion Cents" proposal which was later renamed "Trading Closets" as a new club fundraiser.

2005-06: The first annual "Stuff the Bus" project kicked off with a \$5,000 check to the Alachua County School Board to start an emergency fund to provide assistance to the "Children at Promise" program for homeless school children.

**2007-08:** Altrusa Club of Gainesville celebrated its 50th anniversary with a luncheon attended by current and former members, community leaders, as well as Ouida Fay Paul, a charter member.

**2009-10:** Our club won the Alachua County "Work of Heart" Award as the Outstanding Civic Organization for positively impacting the community through volunteerism.

**2011-12:** Donna Johnson's term as International President rebranded Altrusa, marked by rolling out the new logo, and focusing on the concepts of flexibility, inclusion and clarity, and a strong push to expand our membership. As part of the membership goal, an evening meeting was added to provide a recruiting tool, helping those who were unable to attend luncheon meetings.

**2017-18:** The Altrusa Club of Gainesville Literacy Committe chose Terwilliger Elementary School as the focus of several literacy projects throughout the year. There are hopes this program will become adopted club wide after the project's first year.

# Altrusa House The History of a Dream



1991-92: Altrusa Club of Gainesville's long term goal to open an adult day health care facility in Gainesville was established, with Donna Sorensen as project committee chair. Altrusa club of Gainesville raised more than \$60,000 toward the goal to establish Altrusa House as a future adult day health care center.

**1994-95:** An agreement was negotiated with the City of Gainesville to transfer the property at Greentree Park for the construction of Altrusa House.

**1995-96:** The ground-breaking ceremony for Altrusa House was held on November 19th, with construction scheduled to begin in 1997.

**1997-98:** In February club members attended an "Open House" for Altrusa House and a time capsule was sealed to be opened 20 years later.

**1998:** Altrusa House opened its doors to accept clients on October, 1998.

2009-2010: A gazebo was constructed at Altrusa House in honor of Donna Johnson who served as the 2009-2011 Altrusa International President. This was made possible by the efforts of Altrusa Club's Vocational Committee and a generous donation by Dot Brock of North Carolina.

**2015-16:** A granite monument for veterans was designed and commissioned to be installed in the gardens at Altrusa House. The dedication ceremony, attended by veterans, dignitaries, Altrusans, board members and Altrusa House clients, was a moving experience, especially to Altrusa House's veterans.

**2016-17:** Nancy Hult and Altrusa House Board of Trustees Emeritus member, Ray Jones, developed a Veteran's Oral History Project at Altrusa House. This project provides a written and video record for families to save and cherish. The histories are also submitted to the Library of Congress and to the Samuel Proctor Oral History Project at the University of Florida.
